10.00-11.10	Great North Museum, Barras Bridge	<p>Which Way North: Within the Great North Museum a portal to another world has opened inspired by the 'The Blazing World', one of the earliest works of Science Fiction published in 166 by Margaret Cavendish. You will be met at the main front entrance by a member of the team. They will sign you in and set you off on your self led journey inspired discovering northern pioneers – our inventors, engineers, scientists, designers and artists who are influencing the way we live now and in to the future. Don't forget to pick up your free activity booklets to help facilitate your journey.</p> <p>We recommend approximately 10 minutes in each of the following areas of the museum:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Downstairs your mission to the real North begins in the stars in: To the Moon and Back. Come face to face with monumental discoveries. Take your lead from Helen Sharman's iconic spacesuit and prepare to be amazed by art, artefacts and objects that shed light on the frontiers explored by the North's pioneering spirits.</li> <li>- Uncover some hidden gems in: Buried Treasures: In an Octopus's Garden</li> <li>- Moving upstairs, motion of the body, movement through travel and flights of imagination all inspire your experience in: Human Machine Motion. Discover iconic works, people and big ideas that show artists thinking like scientists, mathematicians as philosophers and humans as elite machines. Gaze upon Stubb's world famous painting of Whistlejacket and a replica of George Cayley's pioneering glider.</li> <li>- Enjoy innovations designed for life and living in: This Kingdom Called Home.</li> </ul> <p>There will be a shop available if you want to schedule time within your allotted 70 mins to buy souvenirs. When you leave, please exit through the main front doors of the museum.</p>

13.50-14.00	intu Eldon Square- Greys Quarter Entrance	intu's Little Black Graphene Dress: Check out the world's most high-tech little black dress and see what the future has in store for your wardrobe.
14.00-14.10	Grey's Monument	See Grey's Monument like never before, for the Great Exhibition, it will be converted into The Worker's Maypole by Zoe Walker and Neil Bromwich, which is an act of 'celebration that brings focus to the collective values at the heart of the North of England'. It will display accolades of society, health, education, science, arts, and fellowship from the North, and which the artists believe are central to life in the North. Grey's Monument is a tribute to Charles Grey, a symbol of the area's role in supporting a fairer society. The worker's maypole has a long history and appears frequently on Miner's Banners.
14.10-14.30	Theatre Royal Plinth	every thing every time: Watch the live story of Newcastle unfold with an installation that turns the city's data into a constantly changing poem.
